Vice Pres.: As Dave Rock is serving as acting President, we had no vice president for this meeting.

Secretary: Lori has signed us up to be part of the AMA Insider National Newsletter. We are permitted to print content from this newsletter in our own newsletter, so Lori is going to start doing so. This newsletter is also available on the AMA website, if anyone is interested. The TAG program, sponsored by AMA, has been extended until February 15th. If any AMA member signs up 3 new members, their AMA membership for next year will be free. In our last meeting, we decided to have several members join the Introductory Pilot Program. Lori made a motion that the club pay the \$5 fee for each person who volunteered for this program, which is Bill White, Jon Soda, and Doug Hannas. Motion was seconded by Dale Hatch and motion passed. Lori will fill out paperwork and give to Dan, Treasurer, to issue check. Thanks for volunteering for this very important program. The instructors will now be listed on the website for visitors to view.

In order to maintain membership in FAA, pilots must keep their AMA membership current. There are still a number of folks who have not renewed membership in the AMA for 2010. Please be sure to do so.

Unfinished Business Several members asked about having a cash option on the Raffle Tickets for the Swap Shop. We did not have a cash option for this time. Patrick made a motion that in the future, we offer a cash option and motion was seconded by Keith and motion passed. Several suggestions were made, such as 50% of the value of the raffle item, and also mention was made that we need to ensure we don't lose money on this. Next time we have a raffle, we need to vote on our cash option and offer that as well as raffle item.

Swap Shop will be held Sunday, February 14th. Tickets have been distributed to members. If anyone needs more tickets, call or email Lori and they will be mailed. Otherwise, we have about 150 tickets left to sell at the door. Bill Lamb is handling the table rental and out of 28 tables available, only 11 tables have been rented. Bill also has to pay \$200 deposit to pick up the key, which will be returned to us. Joe Ramps suggested that we consider a cheaper option for our swap shops. We can get Lordstown Community Center for \$35 because John Fulmer is a member there. Another member reminded us that one of the big reasons for choosing the Trumbull County Fairgrounds is because they rent the field to us for \$1 per year and this is a goodwill gesture. In order to maintain this relationship, even though it's more expensive, it may be in our best interest to continue this practice.

We are going to try and promote the Swap Shop. It did get into the magazine and Lori is going to make a flyer and will send out to everyone. If possible, print out the flyer and post around your local neighborhood, restaurants, schools, etc. Lori will recruit someone to take care of the food for the swap shop.

Nighthawks will have their swap shop on Sunday, January 17th.
